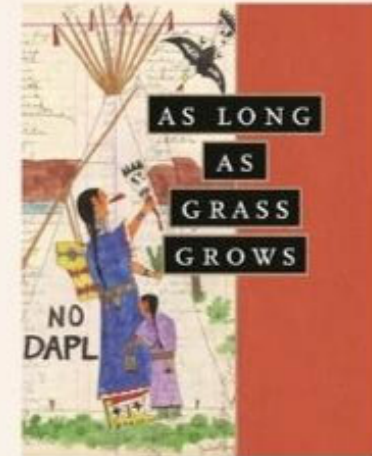


Decolonizing and Indigenizing Environmental Justice
